## Professor Scott Kisker

is an elder in the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, having served as Senior Pastor of Colesburg United Methodist Church in Colesburg, IA. Prior to coming to United Theological Seminary as professor of Church History and Associate Dean for Masters Programs, he was Professor of History of Christianity at Wesley Theological Seminary and University.

Scott's recent publication is *The Band Meeting: Rediscovering Relational Discipleship in Transformational Community*, co-authored with Kevin M. Watson (Franklin, TN: Seedbed, 2017). His academic interests include Pietist and Wesleyan Methodist history and theology, Wesleyan discipleship and small group formation, and evangelism. Director of the Course of Study Program for the Northeast Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church. Dr. Kisker also served as Director of the Charles Wesley Heritage Centre in Bristol, UK and as Associate Pastor for the American Protestant Church in Bonn, Germany. His education includes a B.A. from Swarthmore College, a M.Div. from Duke Divinity School, and a Ph.D. from Drew. Scott is married to Roberta Willison Kisker. They have five children: Maria, Susanna, Isaac, Tabitha, and Naomi.
